This course is being co-sponsored with the Ocean City Police Department. The Law Enforcement Emergency Medical Care Course (LEEMCC) was developed in 2007 and 2008 in response to the Maryland law enforcement community's request to create a medical course with specificity and applicability to law enforcement's needs. The course addresses major medical, trauma, and resuscitation situations encountered by law enforcement officers, including a unique Care Under Fire and Hazardous Circumstances segment.

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Demonstrate proper patient assessment of a medical and trauma patient;
2. Recognize and manage medical emergencies;
3. Recognize and manage traumatic bleeding emergencies;
4. Recognize and manage injuries to the head and spine;
5. Recognize and manage emergencies associated with infants, children, and childbirth;
6. Recognize and provide applicable care under fire and hazardous circumstances;

7. Describe special operational considerations as they pertain to emergency medical care by the law enforcement officer;
8. Demonstrate proper emergency medical care in various scenario based incidents.

This course is designed to meet requirements as mandated by the Maryland Police Training Commission and to meet the annual in-service requirements.

Class Size: Seating limited.

Attendance: You must attend the entire course to receive in-service credit.

Dress Code:

In order to maintain a professional appearance, all in-service officers/staff must follow the prescribed dress code to be admitted to any training held at the Academy.

- Uniform of the day recommended
- Shirt with a collar—**No** t-shirts or tank tops
