This course will satisfy the required 2021 police officer annual in-service training, mandated by the Maryland Police Training Commission to include: rape and sex offenses, victimology, identity theft, child abuse and child exploitation, human trafficking, and hate crimes.

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Define what is Human Trafficking.
- 2. Identify Maryland Human Trafficking Laws.
- 3. Identify patrol practices to investigate Human Trafficking.
- 4. Identify Human Trafficking Resources.
- 5. Identify the basic elements of the crime Child Abuse.
- 6. Identify the various types of terms associated with Child Exploitation.
- 7. Identify the term Child Sexual Molestation.
- 8. Identify the term Child Exploitation.
- 9. Define the term Child Prostitution.
- 10. Define the term Child Pornography.
- 11. Define the term Child Sexual Exploitation.
- 12. Define sexual crimes according to the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- 13. Define sexual abuse of a minor according to the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- 14. Define the term Identity Theft.
- 15. Identify the basic elements of the crime of Identity Theft/Fraud as contained in the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- 16. Identify the resources available to the officer for crimes involving Identity Theft/Fraud.
- 17. Identify resources available to the victim for crimes involving Identity Theft/Fraud.
- 18. Identify several types of personal identifying and/or financial information that may be stolen or compromised to include, at a minimum:
 - personal identifiers such as name, date of birth, address, mother's maiden name.
 - credit/debit/checking/savings/other existing financial accounts.
 - · account access codes/passwords.
 - · social security number.
 - medical records.
 - driver's license number or identification number.
 - educational background/records; and
 - · computer passwords.
- 19. Identify several examples of the crime of Identity Theft/Fraud to include, at a minimum, the theft/fraudulent use of:
 - existing credit/debit cards/financial accounts to obtain goods or services.
 - other financial records/personal financial information to obtain credit or other financial assistance.
 - personal information to obtain various services such as medical treatment, government/social services, educational assistance, etc.; and
 - personal information to obtain government identity cards, licenses/other official documents.
- 20. Identify several ways in which personal information including financial information may be stolen/compromised, to include at a minimum.
 - the use of home computers.
 - discarded/stolen mail.
 - · discarded personal/financial records; and
 - theft/compromise during legitimate use of the information by a victim during a third party transaction.
- 21. Identify several different ways by which an individual can safeguard his/her personal identifying information.
- 22. Identify related evidentiary procedures.
- 23. Identify the contact with and treatment of victims of crimes and delinquent acts.
- 24. Identify what Federal and State Law defines as a Hate Crime.
- 25. Identify the underlying behavior of a Hate Crime to be criminalized under State or Federal law.

- 26. Identify the reporting procedures to the State as required by law.
- 27. Identify Maryland Hate Crime Law 10-302.
- 28. Identify Maryland Hate Crime Law 10-303.
- 29. Identify Federal Hate Crime Law.
- 30. Identify Hate Group Ideology.
