

## **How to Spot Fake News**

- Consider the Source Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact info.
- Read Beyond Headlines can be outrageous in an effort to get clicks. What's the whole story?
- Check the Author Do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they real?
- Supporting Sources? Click on those links. Determine if the info given actually supports the story.
- Check the Date Reposting old news stories doesn't mean they're relevant to current events.
- Is it a Joke? If it is too outlandish, it might be satire. Research the site and author to be sure.
- Check your Biases Consider if your own beliefs could affect your judgment.
- Ask the Experts Ask a librarian or consult a fact-checking site.
