Memorandum of Understanding between
Wor-Wic Community College
and
Salisbury University
regarding
Articulation of the Courses in Criminal Justice
toward the
Bachelor of Science in Forensic Science

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is effective this 31st day of May, 2026 between Wor-Wic Community College ("WWCC"), located at 32000 Campus Drive, Salisbury, Maryland, 21884 and Salisbury University ("SU"), a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, an agency of the State of Maryland, located at 1101 Camden Ave, Salisbury, Maryland, 21801 (collectively the "Parties" or "Institutions").

Recitals

Whereas, WWCC and SU are committed to partnering to expand the educational opportunities and collaborative academic programming of their respective Institutions; and

Whereas, the intent of the Institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula, where appropriate, within articulated programs of studies; and

Whereas, the Institutions agree that the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community is better served through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources.

Whereas, this MOU commits the Parties to full support of an articulation process to deliver certain coursework for students. This MOU will allow SU students to receive critical content knowledge in Criminal Justice toward completion of their Bachelor of Science degree in Forensic Science.

Now therefore, the Parties agree as follows:

I. Purpose

This MOU sets forth the conditions whereby SU students may take courses in Criminal Justice at WWCC as part of program requirements to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Forensic Science.

II. **Courses, instruction and academic support**

- A. WWCC will permit SU students who have declared their major as Forensic Science to enroll in the following WWCC courses as part of their degree program:
 - CMJ 102-Introduction to Criminal Justice
 - CMJ 104 - Criminal Law
 - CMJ 105 - Introduction to Forensic Science
 - CMJ 155 - Ethics in Criminal Justice
 - CMJ 201- Evidence and Procedure
 - CMJ 202-Preliminary Investigations, Interviewing and Report Preparation
 - CMJ 251- Criminal Investigation
 - CMJ 256 - Crime Scene Investigation
- B. Courses will be held on the campus of WWCC during the fall and spring semesters. If conditions necessitate moving the courses to an online or hybrid format, WWCC will notify SU as soon as is practical. If it becomes desirable for WWCC to deliver any of these courses on the campus of SU, SU and WWCC will collaborate to find appropriate space and scheduling.
- C. SU students will have access to all the academic support resources available to all non-degree seeking WWCC students including advising, tutoring, computing, and library resources. Additionally, the instructors at WWCC will make themselves available to SU students via in-person or virtual office hours, or by phone appointment for support outside of scheduled class times.

III. Admission to WWCC

- A. SU students seeking to enroll in criminal justice courses must first enroll in the Investigative Forensic Technology Certificate at WWCC. There is no fee to apply at WWCC. SU students only need to submit transcripts when applying for the certificate degree. SU students admitted to WWCC will be notified of their admission status via email.
- B. In accordance with the WWCC Policy on Student Classification for Admission and Tuition Purposes, SU students seeking to enroll at WWCC must complete the residency portion of the application for admission to determine residency status for tuition and billing purposes. Students with questions about their residency status should contact the Admissions Office at wwcc.

IV. Enrollment/Registration

- A. Upon admission in the Investigative Forensic Technology Certificate, SU students are eligible to enroll in WWCC's Criminal Justice courses. Students will be enrolled in courses by the Academic Advising department following the same policies for all students.
- B. SU will provide the WWCC Criminal Justice Program with verification of good standing in the Bachelor of Science in Forensic Science program for SU students in this MOU; however, students will maintain their own academic standing within WWCC based on its catalog policies.
- C. SU students shall assume responsibility for their courses including all academic requirements
and any WWCC financial obligations that are not covered by this MOU. SU students are expected to comply with all WWCC policies and procedures including enrollment dates and deadlines for applicable courses, as noted in WWCC's academic calendar.
- D. SU students are expected to comply with the standards of conduct articulated in the WWCC Code of Conduct.

V. Payment of Tuition and Fees

- A. SU agrees to pay for WWCC tuition and mandatory fees associated with each SU student's registration in any course listed in Section II.A of this agreement SU will provide WWCC's Accounts Receivable & Cashiers Office with a list of all eligible SU students registered for WWCC classes and the classes in which they are enrolled at least one week before WWCC's billing deadline and again on the first day of WWCC's semester.
- B. Upon receipt of the list from SU, WWCC will place a hold on each student account to prevent the student from being dropped due to no payment. WWCC will review and confirm the accuracy of the list provided by SU and submit an invoice to SU for payment. WWCC will send an invoice to SU immediately after the deadline to receive payment. SU will pay the invoice within thirty (30) days of receipt. WWCC agrees not to charge SU late fees.
- C. SU students will be responsible for any costs incurred at WWCC not covered by this MOU, including costs related to course materials and laboratory fees.

VI. Grades/Transcripts/Credits

- A. A list of SU students expected to enroll in WWCC courses named in this MOU will be provided by SU to the records and registration and billing offices at WWCC. SU agrees to send transcripts requested by WWCC for students participating in this MOU to WWCC's Registrar as needed.
- B. Final grades will be posted to the student's official WWCC record (transcript) immediately after grades are submitted by the instructor and approved by WWCC's Office of the Registrar.
- C. At the end of each semester, WWCC will send the batch of transcripts for each student enrolled in WWCC courses named in this MOU directly to the Assistant Registrar at SU.
- D. In accordance with the Transfer with Success Act and COMAR 13B.06.01.04, as an exception to the standard 70-credit transfer limit from Maryland community colleges, Salisbury University will award credit for courses in this MOU taken by students to fulfill unmet program requirements, provided those courses are applicable to the student's degree plan. However, if a student has already reached the 70-credit transfer threshold and the additional course does not satisfy any remaining program requirement, no further transfer credit will be awarded.
- E. As an exception to Salisbury University's standard transfer credit policy, grades earned in courses taken under this MOU will be transferred and included in the student's SU cumulative GPA, using the university's standard GPA calculation.

VII. Administration of this MOU

- A. For SU, this MOU is being administered by Dr. Michael Scott, Dean of the Henson School of Science and Technology (msscott@salisbury.edu; 410-543-6489).
- B. For WWCC, this MOU is being administered by John Moses, Director of Criminal Justice (jmoses@worwic.edu; 410-572-8753).
- C. As administrators of this MOU, the respective designees of each Institution will facilitate any needed updates in collaboration with Institutional points of contact and ensure that any renewals are executed timely.

VIII. Governing Law

The terms of this MOU shall be governed by the laws of the State of Maryland of the United States, without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.

IX. Term, Renewal and Termination of MOU

- A. The initial term of this MOU is May 31, 2026 through June 30, 2027, but shall automatically renew for twelve (12) additional months each ensuing year unless one party gives the other written notice of its intention to terminate no later than the first day of classes of the beginning of the semester previous to the termination of the MOU.
- B. The Parties agree to mutually address and resolve any concerns or disputes related to this MOU. Should the Parties be unable to resolve any dispute arising from this MOU, WWCC and SU agree that termination of this MOU is the sole remedy.
- C. Should termination occur, both Institutions agree to continue to carry out the terms of this MOU for any student currently participating in the program.

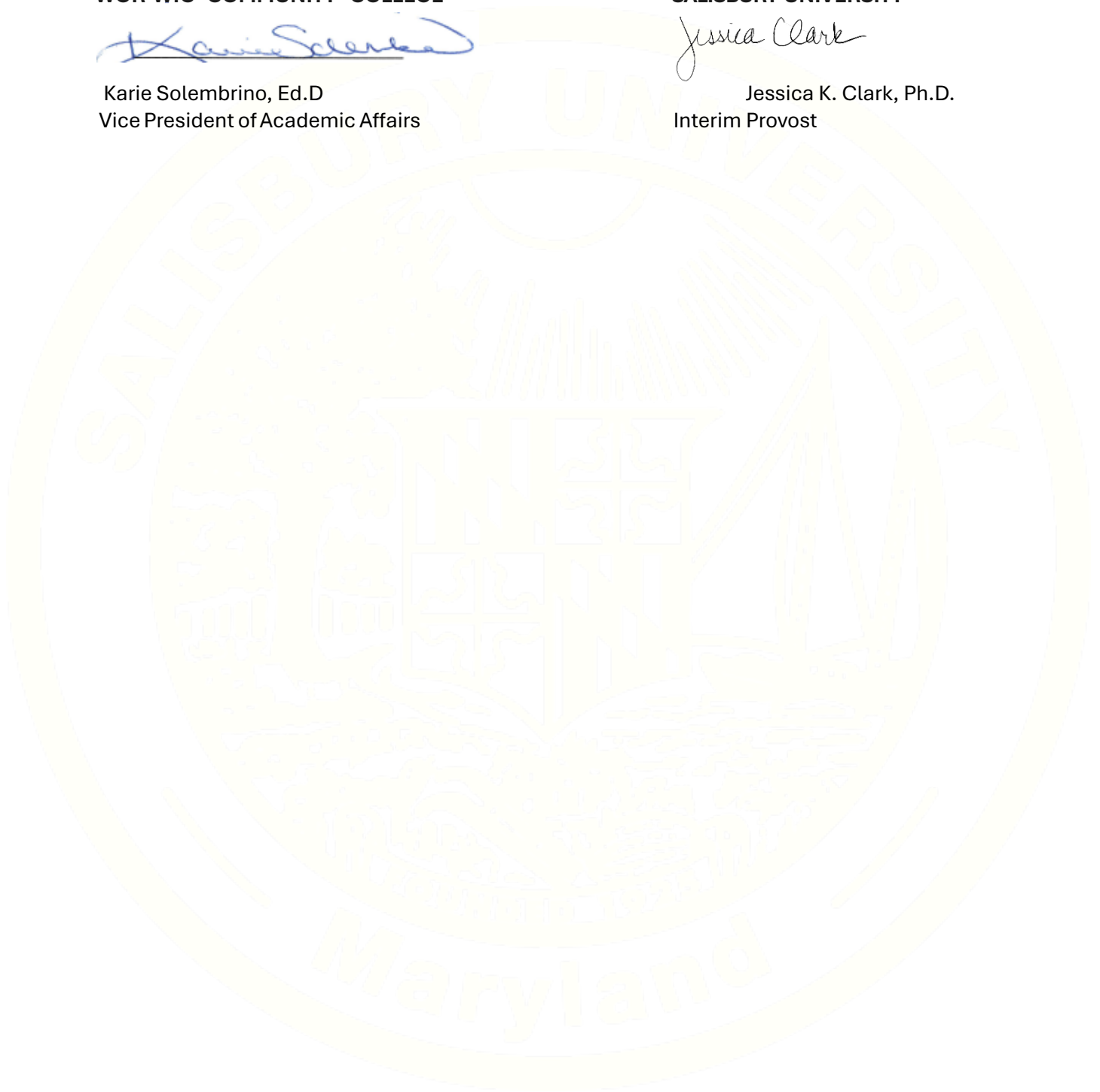

I. Identification of parties

- A. Wor-Wic Community College (WWCC) is a community college located at 32000 Campus Drive, Salisbury, Maryland, 20184.
- B. Salisbury University (SU) is a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, an agency of the State of Maryland, located at 1101 Camden Ave, Salisbury, Maryland, 21801.

II. Preamble

This Memorandum of Understanding ("Agreement"), dated this 21st day of May 2026, is by and between WWCC and SU (collectively, the "Parties" or "Institutions"). This Agreement sets forth the joint curricula and program requirements for the completion of the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, Forensic Science Technology Concentration from WWCC and the Bachelor of Science in Integrated Science, Forensic Science at Salisbury University.

Whereas, WWCC and SU are committed to partnering to expand the educational opportunities and collaborative academic programming of their respective institutions; and

Whereas, the two Institutions are committed to providing a smooth transition for students wishing to earn an associate of applied science degree and a baccalaureate degree; and

Whereas, the intent of the Institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula, where appropriate, within articulated programs of studies; and

Whereas, the Institutions agree that the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community is better served through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources.

Therefore, this Agreement commits the Parties to full support of an articulation process to deliver coursework for students. For WWCC students, this Agreement will result in an Associate of Applied Science degree from WWCC and credit toward a Bachelor of Science degree at SU.

The Parties agree to the following:

III. Academic requirements

- A. The Institutions agree to follow the joint program curriculum and course by course articulation delineated in Appendix 1, which is attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement.
- B. Both Institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating, and presenting the articulated program information to students.
- C. Students who have graduated from WWCC must first apply to SU. Once a completed application is received, WWCC graduates who have completed the associate's degree program in Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, Forensic Science Technology concentration, with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will be granted admission to SU as an Integrated Science major.
- D. All articulated course credits applied towards satisfying Bachelor of Science in Integrated Science major requirements earned with a C or better will be accepted for transfer according to the articulation matrix in Appendix 1.

- E. SU shall provide a Checklist for students as a planning tool for completing coursework required for the Bachelor of Science in Integrated Science in Appendix 2, attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement.
- F. Students intending to transfer should apply for admission by the priority deadline for the semester for which they intend to enroll.
- G. Students are subject to all specific policies pertaining to students admitted to the SU baccalaureate degree program in Bachelor of Science in Integrated Science.

IV. General Provisions

- A. Each Institution is responsible for the administration of its respective courses, including content, requirements, faculty and student services (to include, but not limited to, admissions, financial aid, class registration, etc.).
- B. When enrolled in a SU course, the student is subject to all policies and procedures applicable to SU students. When enrolled in a WWCC course, a student is subject to all policies and procedures applicable to WWCC students. Additional joint policies and procedures may be adopted and implemented at the discretion of both Parties.
- C. The Parties recognize that course scheduling beyond the associate's degree level resides exclusively with SU and will be coordinated with WWCC by the designated SU representative. Where academic calendars differ, the partners will work together to coordinate class offerings and class schedules.
- D. The disclosure of information about individual students is limited by the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The Parties agree that release of student educational records to the other Party is conditioned upon the submission of a signed agreement by the student authorizing such release.
- E. The Parties shall publicize any joint offerings in their respective catalogs, website, and other materials as appropriate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, neither Party may use the names or marks of the other without the prior approval of the other Party.
- F. The Parties shall inform students in their respective programs of the complementary program opportunities available at each other's respective institution, support each other's marketing efforts toward the same, and encourage such students to apply to programs consistent with an individual student's interests.
- G. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, both Parties retain full

authority over their respective courses, programs, and requirements. Both Parties reserve the right to make changes to their respective courses, programs, and requirements. However, each Party shall give to the other reasonable notice and details of changes to this articulation Agreement and other changes in its courses, programs, and requirements that may affect this Agreement. Further, neither Party will terminate this Agreement at a time that would deter a "cohort-in-progress" from completing graduation within the originally designated timeframe

- H. For SU, this agreement is being administered by Dr. Michael Scott, Dean of the Henson School of Science and Technology (msscott@salisbury.edu; 410-543--6489). For WWCC, this agreement is being administered by John Moses, Director of Criminal Justice (jmoses@worwic.edu; 410-572-8753). As administrators of the agreement, the respective institutional designees will monitor the agreement, facilitate any needed updates in collaboration with institutional partners and ensure renewals are executed timely.
- I. The designated representatives shall meet as needed, at a mutually agreeable time and location, to discuss various collaborations and other topics of interest to either Institution. A Party may change its representative by giving notice to the other party.
- J. Either institution may at any time recommend changes to this Agreement. Both Institutions reserve the right to modify the programs as deemed necessary and agree to inform the appropriate representatives of the other Institution of recommended changes. This Agreement may be modified only by a writing signed by both parties.
- K. All notices under this Agreement must be in writing; delivered in person, by U.S. mail or by email.
- L. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to form a joint venture between the Parties. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to create rights or benefits for any person or entity other than the Parties.
- M. This Agreement integrates the entire agreement of the Parties and supersedes any and all prior and/or contemporaneous agreements between the Parties, written or oral, with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.

V. Term, Renewal and Termination of Agreement

- A. This Agreement is dated May 31, 2026 and will last until June 30, 2031. This agreement can be renewed with the consent of both parties.
- B. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing the other party with written

notice of its intention to terminate the Agreement, pursuant to Section IV.G above.

- C. Should termination occur, the Parties shall develop a process that will reasonably allow students admitted to and enrolled in joint programming to continue their studies.

The pathway includes a recommended student curricular pathway to complete the Associate of Applied Science degree and the Bachelor of Science degree requirements.

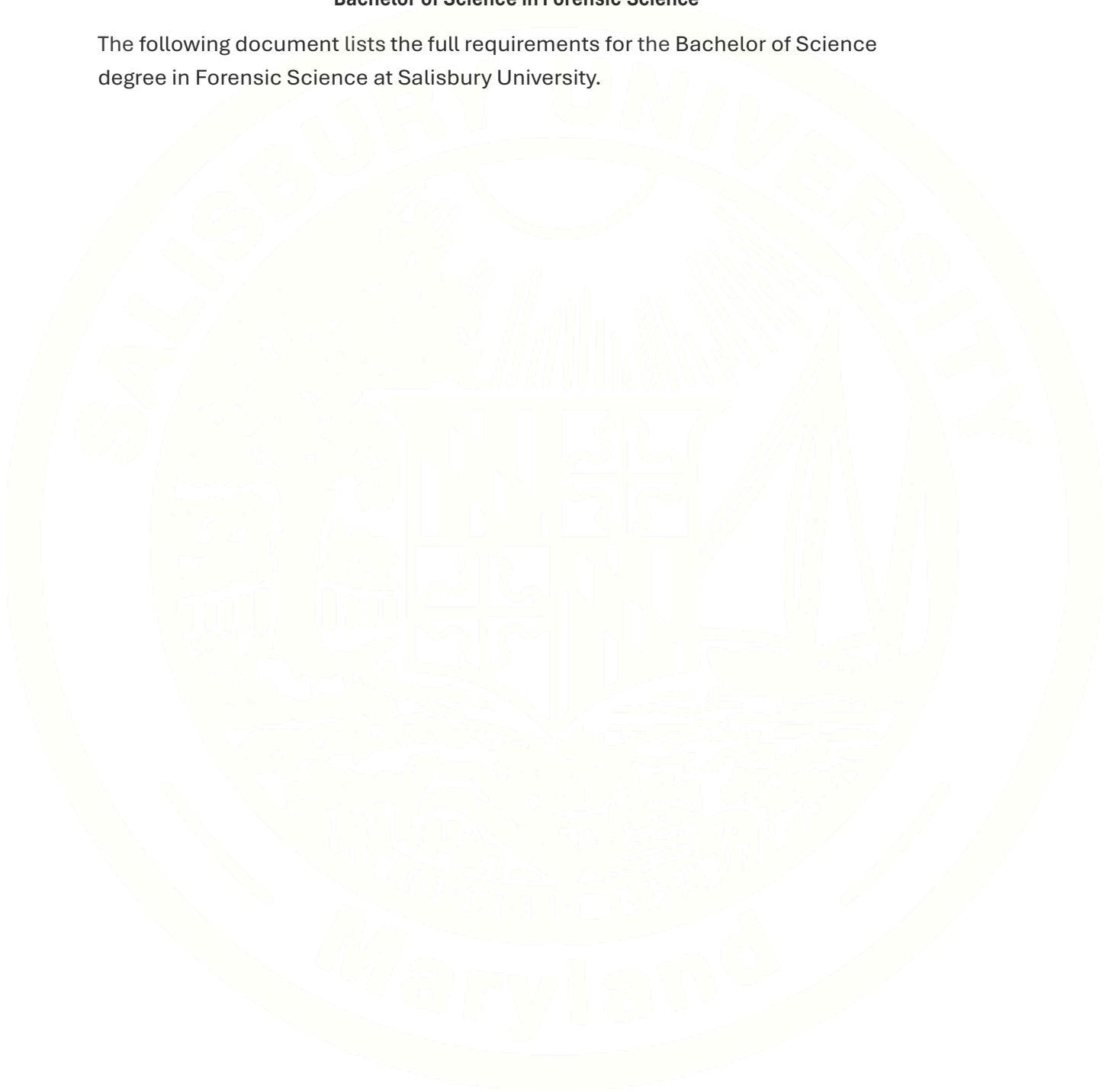
While the student is not required to take all courses in the precise order recommended in the articulation pathway, all course equivalencies described in the pathway at Salisbury University are binding.
