## Special Note: Agencies are encouraged to bring a police traffic speed monitoring device to class if available.

This course is designed to certify police officers in the use of laser speed measurement equipment. This course meets the criteria established by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Topics to be discussed will include the benefits of effective speed control, basic principles of laser speed measurement, laws, court rulings and regulations, procedures affecting laser speed measurement, vehicle tracking techniques, and courtroom testimony.

## Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Describe the association between excessive speed, crashes, deaths, and injuries as well as the highway safety benefits of effective speed control.
- 2. Describe the basic principles of LIDAR speed measurement.
- 3. Demonstrate the basic skills in testing and operating LIDAR instruments.

- 4. Identify the specific LIDAR instruments used by your agency and describe their major components.
- 5. Identify and describe laws, court rulings, regulations, policies, and procedures affecting LIDAR speed measurement and speed enforcement in general.
- 6. Demonstrate the ability to prepare and present records and courtroom testimony relating to LIDAR speed measurement.

This course is designed to meet requirements as mandated by the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions and to meet the annual in-service requirements.
