

This course is designed to certify police officers in the use of radar speed measurement equipment. This course meets the criteria established by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Topics to be discussed will include the benefits of effective speed control, basic principles of radar speed measurement, laws, court rulings and regulations, procedures affecting radar speed measurement, vehicle tracking techniques, and courtroom testimony.

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Identify ways to improve the effectiveness of speed enforcement through the proper and efficient use of radar speed measurement instruments.
2. Describe the association between speed offenses and motor vehicle crashes and injuries.
3. Define the term Radar and describe the origin and history of radar equipment.
4. Describe the basic operation of a stationary radar instrument.
5. Describe the basic operation of a moving radar instrument.

Special Note: Agencies are encouraged to bring a police traffic speed monitoring device to class if available.

This course is designed to meet requirements as mandated by the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions and to meet the annual in-service requirements.

Class Size: Restricted size, seating is limited.

Attendance: You must attend the entire class to receive in-service credit.

Dress Code:

To maintain a professional appearance, all in-service officers/staff must follow the prescribed dress code to be admitted to any training held at the Academy.

- Uniform of the day recommended
- Shirt with a collar—**No** t-shirts or tank tops
- Docker style pants, BDU's or suit—**No** shorts or jeans
- Full shoe with socks—**No** sandals

Firearms—All officers wearing a handgun on campus in plain view MUST also wear his/her badge in plain view.

Academy attendees will be denied admittance to the classroom or range and a report will be sent to the Chief/Sheriff/Warden/Director, stating the reasons the officer/staff was not allowed to attend the training session.
